The Front Office would like to remind every family to go on-line to verify your student's demographic information, emergency contact information and other data. You have until September 30 to update your information. NOTE, this is separate from the paper work brought home, that paper work will be kept on file at Maple.

New to The Source? The Source provides access to student record information such as attendance, assessment scores, library information and now the student data verification form.

How do I get started?

- Visit *ps.seattleschools.org* and log in.
- Select the student whose information you would like to verify along the top
- Select the Data Verification Form
- Agree to the terms and conditions
- Click "Begin Forms"
