#### **Principal Update - Elena Sanchez**

- 546 students enrolled.
- Parent Teacher conferences coming up
  - o ELL families are being contacted now and schedule with interpretation.
  - o Families sign up at Multi-Ethnic Dinner.
- Blacktop Update
  - Work in progress.
  - Noted to be less hazardous.

- Lines are painted (4-square, etc.).
- No installation of tether ball poles.
- Grass seeds planted and that area is roped off.
- o Principal Sanchez will reach out to PTSA next week if work stalls.
- Boundary Update
  - Principal Sanchez explained since the October 2<sup>nd</sup> Meeting held by the District, no news on this issue.
  - The timeline presented at that meeting indicated the School Board would vote no sooner than January on boundary changes.
  - Boundary changes include 4 different variables: (1) adopting the 2013 approved boundary change as is for 2020/21; (2) including the Georgetown neighborhood in a proposed modified boundary change with slightly less Beacon Hill residents in the change area; (3) moving up the boundary change to the 2019/20 school year; and (4) grandfathering plans. <a href="Proposed Boundary Changes for Maple">Proposed Boundary Changes for Maple</a>
  - None of these changes address the planning for 2019/20 that starts in February for Principal Sanchez and Maple staff.
  - Some Georgetown parents present described their experience in attending the recent District Operations Meeting: School Board surprised there was a new option on the table and Board needing more time to make a decision...
  - Discussion followed regarding the BEX V Levy list where schools are prioritized for new buildings; Maple is not on that list; Maple requires an "equity score" before even being considered for the list
  - BEX V Levy now places Kimball Elementary #8; of note on the list 21 North end school and only 4 Southeast schools. \*\*Please see attachment for the current list
